The budget provision for the year 2006-09 is Rs. 200.00 lekbs out of which Rs 60.50 lakins has been expend up to November 2006 on 242 girls.

2- INDERA AWAS YOLANA:- In the year 2007-05, to provide houses to the homeless families belonging to primitive tribal groups (Buxa and Raji) an amount of Rs. 110.95 lakhs at the rate of Rs. 35000.00 per house construction per family has been spent for the construction of houses for 317 homeless families.

The budget provision for the financial year 2008-09 in Rs. 179.91 Lakhs

3- JEEVIKA AVSAR PROTSAHAN VOJANA:— The scheme is being implemented by Utterakhand Bahuddeshiya Vitta Evam Vikas Nigam Ltd DehraDun, under which different training programmes are conducted for educated unemployed youth belonging to scheduled tribes. The expenditure on the training component is born by the Comporation. After the training, they are provided loans under self-employment scheme so that they may develop into self-reliant individuals. In the financial year 2006-07 adding the unutilized fund of the provious year, Rs. 82.63 Laids has been spend for 912 beneficiaries. In the year 2007-08, Rs. 1.50 Lakhs has been expended on 20 beneficiaries. The Budget provision for the financial year 2008-09 under the plan head is Rs. 100.00 Lakhs

d- Financially Aided Iribal sub plan Urtarationed Sheep Development Board. Debradus.

This scheme is being implemented Uttasakhami Bahuddahiya Vitt Evam Vikas Nigam Ltd. Debradum and it nime to provide opportunities of self

employment to the memployed persons of scheduled tribes. The cost of training is borne by Uttarekhand Bahuddeshiya Viita Evam Vikas Nigam Ltd. Dehradun. After the training loan is provided to them under self employment schemes in order to make them self reliant. Under the schemes, it is proposed to benefit 900 beneficiaries across a period of three years. The various objectives are as under:-

- 1- To train 300 sheep farmers (100 Per year)
- 2- To train 300 goat farmers (100 Per year)
- 3- To establish 300 small sheep units (100 Per year)
- 4- To establish 300 male goat units for the distribution of male goats (100 Per year). This scheme is being implemented in three districts of Uttarakhand i.e., Uttarkashi, Chamoli and Pithoragach.

5- Uttarakhand Bambob and Fiber Development Board.

This scheme is financed by the Social Welfare Department, Uttarakhand and the implementing agency is Uttarakhand Bamboo fiber development. Board, it aims to raise the average family income of Scheduled Tribes families by promoting avenues to enhance the value & quality of artisan product made out of natural fibers. It also intends to provide new design, technology & marketing opportunities which will lead to greater employment opportunities. for the un employed youth of the State.

	(b) Dairy Development Department Uttrakhand:- Dairy Development Department Uttrakhand Haldwani, provides marketing facilities to milk producers of Utrarekhand through Rural milk Cooperative Societies.
	(c) Agriculture Department Uttrakhand Dehradum. It has never come to the knowledge of Department of Agriculture that there is any need of institutional arrangements to regulate the marketing produce collected by the STs from reserve forest or forest in Uttarakand. Most of the tribes of Uttarakhand do not depend on forest produce and hence they are different from other tribes of India.
	(d) Fisheries Department Uttrakhand Debradum The produce i.e.fish is not allowed to be collected from reserve forest. However, the produce collected from forest under occupation of STs is consumed locally.
