ATIONAL COMMISSION FOR SCHEDULED TRIBES

The National Commission for Scheduled Tribes has been set up with effect from 19 February 2004 by amending Article 338 and by inserting a new Article 338A in the Constitution through the Constitution (89 Amendment) Act, 2003, which inter-alia, enjoins upon the Commission to oversee the implementation of various safeguards provided to Scheduled Tribes under the Constitution or any other law for the time being in force or under any other order of the Govt. and to evaluate the working of such safeguards. The Commission comprises a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson and three full-time (including one lady) Members.

2. Composition of the present Commission (7th Commission)

The term of office of Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Members is Three (03) years from the date of assumption of charge. The Chairperson has been given the rank of Union Cabinet Minister, the Vice Chairperson has the rank of a Minister of State, and other Members have the rank of Secretary to the Government of India.



3. Duties and Functions of the Commission

The Constitution of India under Clause (5) of Article 338A has assigned the following duties and functions to the Commission: -

- a) To investigate and monitor all matters relating to the safeguards provided for the Scheduled Tribes under the Constitution or any other law for the time being in force or under any order of the Government and to evaluate the working of such safeguards;
- b) To inquire into specific complaints with respect to the deprivation of rights and safeguards of the Scheduled Tribes;
- c) To participate and advise in the planning process of socioeconomic development of the Scheduled Tribes and to evaluate the progress of their development under the Union and any State;
- d) To present to the President, annually and at such other times as the Commission may deem fit, reports upon the working of those safeguards.
- e) To make in such reports recommendations as to the measures that should be taken by the Union or any State for effective implementation of those safeguards and other measures for the

protection, welfare and socio-economic development of the Scheduled Tribes and;

f) To discharge such other functions in relation to the protection, welfare, development, and advancement of the Scheduled Tribes as the President may, subject to the provisions of any law made by Parliament, by rule specify.

The NCST has been assigned certain additional functions *vide* the Ministry of Tribal Affairs Notification dated 23.8.2005 in the exercise of the powers conferred by sub-clause (f) of Clause (5) of Article 338A, namely:

- a) Measures that need to be taken over conferring ownership rights in respect of minor forest produce to STs living in forest areas.
- b) Measures to be taken to safeguard the rights of the tribal communities over mineral resources, water resources, etc., as laid down by law.
- c) Measures to be taken for the development of Tribal to plug loopholes and work on more viable livelihood strategies.
- d) Measures to be taken to improve the efficacy of relief and rehabilitation measures for tribal groups displaced by development projects.
- e) Measures are to be taken to prevent alienation of tribal people from land and to rehabilitate such people effectively, in which case alienation has already taken place.

- Measures to be taken to elicit maximum cooperation and involvement of tribal communities for protecting forests and undertaking social afforestation.
- g) Measures to be taken to ensure full implementation of the provision of the Panchayat (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act,1996.
- h) Measures to be taken to reduce and ultimately eliminate the practice of shifting cultivation by tribal that lead to their continuous disempowerment and degradation of land and the environment.

4. Powers of the Commission

While investigating the matters referred to in sub-clause (a) or inquiring into any complaint referred to in sub-clause (b) of clause 5, the Commission has all the powers of a Civil Court trying a suit and in particularly in respect of the following matters, namely: -

- a) Summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person from any part of India and examining him on oath;
- b) Requiring the discovery and production of any document;
- c) Receiving evidence on affidavits;

- d) Requisitioning any public record or copy thereof from any court or office;
- e) Issuing summons/communications for the examination of witnesses and documents;
- f) Any other matters which the President may by rule determine.

5. Consultation by the Union and State Government with the Commission

In accordance with clause (9) of Article 338A of the Constitution, the Union and every State Government shall consult the Commission on all major policy matters affecting Scheduled Tribes.

6. Monitoring

The Commission, while investigating matters relating to the safeguards provided under the Constitution, monitors the implementation and working of safeguards, which include:

- a) Acting upon Article 23 of the Constitution, which prohibits traffic in human beings and forced labour, etc., concerning STs.
- b) Prohibition of child labour under Article 24 in respect of STs.
- c) Educational safeguards under Article 15 (4) for reservation of seats for STs in educational institutions.
- d) Economic safeguards under Article 244, the working of Fifth and Sixth Schedules, and the release of grants for raising the administration level in tribal areas.
- e) Safeguarding STs' distinct language, script, or culture under Article 29(i).
- f) Working of service safeguards provided under Articles 16 (4), 16 (4) (a),16 (4) (B), and 335 providing for adequate representation of Scheduled Tribes in appointments or posts.
- g) Enforcement of various laws such as:
 - a. The Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.
 - b. Bonded Labour System (Abolition) Act, 1976 (regarding Scheduled Tribes).

- c. The Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986 (regarding Scheduled Tribes).
- d. State Acts and Regulations concerning alienation and restoration of land belonging to Scheduled Tribes.
- e. Forest Conservation Act, 1980 (in respect of Scheduled Tribes)
- f. The Panchayat (Extension to the Scheduled Areas) Act, 1996.
- g. Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (in respect of Scheduled Tribes)

7. Annual Reports of the Commission

Clause 5(d) of Article 338A mandates the Commission "to present to the President, annually and at such other times as the Commission may deem, reports upon the working of those safeguards," and Clause 5(e) provides "to make in such reports, recommendations as to the measures that should be taken by the Union or any State for the effective implementation of those safeguards and other measures for the protection, welfare and socio-economic development of the Scheduled Tribes."

Clause 6 of Article 338A provides that "the President shall cause all such reports to be laid before each House of Parliament along with a Memorandum explaining the action taken or proposed to be taken on the recommendations relating to the Union and the reasons for the nonacceptance, if any, of any of such recommendations.

Clause 7 of Article 338A provides that "Where any such report or any part thereof relates to any matter with which any State Government is concerned, a copy of such report shall be forwarded to the Governor of the State who shall cause it to be laid before the Legislature of the State along with a Memorandum explaining the action taken or proposed to be taken on the recommendations relating to the State and the reasons for non-acceptance, if any, of any of such recommendations.
